I just filled out my licence plate renewals for the state of Wisconsin, a yearly task and cost in order to legally operate a vehicle in our state. Renewals are something that happen in all areas of our lives these days; subscriptions, phones, internet, vehicles, apps the list could go on and on of things we need to renew every year or month. One thing we don't need to "renew" every year is our standing with Christ. Now don't hear that as me saying once we say yes to Jesus we don't do anything for the rest of our lives because we are definitely not called to a life of passivity in our relationship with the Lord.

What I am bringing up is a key point of Christ's sacrifice for our sins. In Christ, there is no "renewal" both on his end and ours. If Christ's sacrifice required renewal, then year after year Christ would have to die once again for the sins of the people similar to the sacrifices that were made under the levitical priesthood. Year after year they had to make sacrifices to pay for the sins of the nation, ultimately these sacrifices all point towards Christ as a perfect fulfillment of those sacrifices, one in which there is no need for a renewal.

On our end, we do not need to respond to every altar call for salvation as if the sins which we have most recently committed have caused us to no longer be His child. That would be a type of works based salvation, where we are constantly having to make amends for our sins even if it is just in the way of confessing our sins and asking for forgiveness. Instead, God in his love for us has paid for our sins past, present and future. Now that doesn't mean we shouldn't still confess to the Lord when we sin, but it means we come to him with confidence knowing that our sins have already been taken care of, they are already paid for! What good news it is!

I believe that this is a huge part of the freedom which is offered and found in Christ. Where else do you experience the kind of confident freedom that no matter how bad you've messed up, you have a perfect infinite God welcoming you into his arms and covering you by his blood with his love and forgiveness.

So next time you have to renew something, your drivers license, fishing license, or subscription to your favorite streaming service, take some time and thank God that you never need to renew with him, you are always his child.

As the owner of an older house, I am dealing with a steady drip of things needing attention. The need to replace my old roof became urgent when it started leaking. My very independent contractor comes late, leaves early or does not show up at all some days. He is a professed Christian, who has shared his beliefs with me. I am usually pleased with his work and his willingness to tackle a variety of issues including some yard work. I hoped and prayed he would do better to finish in a timelier manner. I had a long checklist of items to finish and clean up this week.

I need to remember that every morning is a new opportunity to show compassion and patience, like God does for me even when I repeatedly complain to Him about all the delays. Today all the house and yard projects I contracted for are now finally completed. Hallelujah! All is well and I get my much quieter house back. Praise the Lord, His mercies never cease!

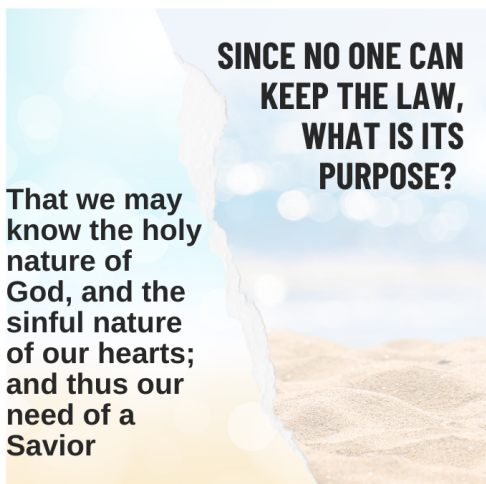
