Welcome to Spring? It was -10 this morning so it is a little odd to be thinking about Spring, but I know it is around the corner. Something that has been on my mind a lot recently, are the benefits of our church being a part of a denomination. For those of you unfamiliar with that word, I find this definition helpful, "A religious organization whose congregations are united in their adherence to its beliefs and practices." We are members of the Evangelical Presbyterian Church, a smaller denomination in the United States composed of 629 churches. An important question that is welcomed to be asked is, "why be a part of a denomination?" Those who are against denominations would argue that they are just an unnecessary expensive oversight (in the EPC there is no cost but a recommended support). I want to briefly mention three benefits of being in the EPC, and there are many more.

Accountability: I lead with this because I view it as the thing that is most missed in the independent church, but it is often not known to be missed until it is too late. We live in a sinful fallen world and there is an enemy who is trying to do anything he can to derail the mission of the church. Too often we hear stories of churches, pastors, leaders who have fallen prey to various temptations whether they be temptations of power, pleasure, greed, or influence. When a denomination is functioning well, it provides accountability and a means of a church working through these challenging circumstances. The denomination gives a place for those church members who recognize something isn't quite right to be able to report their concerns to a neutral party to assist the church in staying faithful to the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Shared Mission: A second thing that cannot be done well by a single congregation is to accomplish goals and works in which collaboration is required. I love going to our meetings and hearing about the work God is doing around the world through EPC World Outreach or church planting. In a denomination we can come together to plant churches, send missionaries, and see God move in mighty ways around the world. While this is still possible in independence the amount of resources required make it impossibly difficult for all but the largest churches.

Equipping: Perhaps the most day to day benefit of the denomination is the training and equipping your pastor, elders, and other members receive through the gatherings of the denomination. I know that I have benefited tremendously in my growth as a pastor from our Presbytery and General Assembly meetings. I come back refreshed, encouraged, challenged, and feeling like I have met with the Lord and am now ready for the next day. If you ever want to join in a meeting, please let me or another elder know and we would love to find a good one for you to be a part of.

There are so many more reasons that a denomination is a blessing, for a full article on it you can look up "in praise of denominations by Kevin Deyoung" he has an article published by the Gospel Coalition that goes into many more benefits of which I do not have the space to write about here.

Are We Really Listening?

I have had countless opportunities in multiple roles to be a good listener who comforts and encourages others. Sadly, I have often ben preoccupied, impatient or too intent on what I am going to say next to truly listen to what the other person was saying. Many of us have the inclination to fix things. Too often, we try to impose our opinion or solutions for the situation, when they just want to be heard. A truly compassionate listener offers a safe and nonjudgemental space. Sometimes, a hurt or sad person many just need some company. They may not want verbal communication beyond a few words. Listening can mean just being there, so they are not alone. It may be short phone calls, cards or texts that show that someone cares about them.

Children may just want someone to spend time with them. We are sometimes only half listening or do not fully engage when children interrupt or make us impatient. Children will stop coming to interact with you f htey are not excouraged by your sincere attentive or funny responses. They need a trusted adult who wants to spend quality time with them and provides a safe place to share their hurts and concerns. I enjoy listening to their stories and hearing their unique views of their everyday life experiences. It reminds me of my younger days and sometimes I share a funny

family story or memory. It may or may not have a lesson. The old teacher in me can't help using teachable moments like Jesus did to share the Good News to his listeners.

When older people start to have more profound memory issues or difficulties with some basic life skills, they can try the patience of family and friends. A loving listener learns to smile and encourage them when Grandma again forgets what is going to happen next or that she has already told you that bit of news or story several times. I was fortunate to have been blessed with loving role models who listened to me when I needed someone or who I saw lending a compassionate listening ear to others. God is the ultimate good listener who loves all his children. As God's children, we are to love and care for others. One way we can do this is to become better listeners. Jesus instructed his followers, "Anyone who has ears to hear should listen and understand." Mark 4:23 NLT Lord help me to hear and follow your teaching words to become a better listener.
